

PAI GOW POKER TECHNICAL STANDARDS

- ✓ **CLEARING HANDS**
Whenever your hands leave the surface area of the table always clear them with your palms up.
- ✓ **RANKING DEALERS HAND**
The dealer will rank their hand by placing all seven cards in one row according to rank with the highest card on the left and descending to the right.
- ✓ **COMMISSIONS**
Winning hands will be paid and commissions collected and then discarded.
- ✓ **HAND DEALT PROCEDURE**
In the event that the Shuffle Master is not available, the cards will be shuffled in accordance with the single deck shuffle.
- ✓ **WAGERS**
No wagers may be made, increased, or withdrawn once the dealer presses the "deal" button or the Dealer begins to shake the dice.
