## Bonus Baccarat

Bonus Baccarat is a mini-baccarat bonus wager that pays on the poker value of the combination of player and banker hands.

Bonus Baccarat is standard baccarat with an optional bonus wager. All rules pertaining to baccarat as posted on the website will remain the same and are not altered in this game except as noted in these rules of play.

If the Baccarat outcome results in 4 board cards, the bet is pushed; neither player nor house wins. If the Baccarat outcome results in 5 board cards, the 5 card payoff table is used to determine winning bonus bets. If the Baccarat outcome results in 6 board cards (both the player and banker get a third card), the 6 card payoff table is used to determine winning bonus bets.


## **Dealing Procedures**

Bonus Baccarat is dealt in the same manner as Mini-Baccarat once all bets have been placed. Basic and bonus bets must be within posted house limits.

The player/banker/tie baccarat bets are settled first. After basic bets are settled, bonus wagers are taken or paid according to the proper pay scale.

If house rules allow, players may bet just the Bonus Wager.
